CURRICULUM

Mary Queen of Peace PS has a 3-year School Development Plan (SDP) to manage its curricular, pastoral care, finance and accommodation priorities. This month we look at our curriculum priorities for 2017-18, starting with **LITERACY**. Our reading standards are high in Mary Queen of Peace PS.

- Nationally 50% of the children have reading scores ≥ 100 (a score of ≥ 100 means a pupil is average or better). In our school, **68%** of the children have a reading score which is average or better. This is 18% above the national level.
- A score of ≤ 85 means a pupil may be experiencing difficulties with their reading. Nationally, 16 % of the population are in this category. In our school it is **6%**.
- A reading score of ≥ 115 indicates that a child is reading at a very high level of ability. Nationally it is 16%. In our school the figure is **24%**.

This year there will be a particular focus on the children comprehending and appreciating what they are reading. There is a gap between what the child can read aloud and what they understand. We want to close that gap by involving the children in activities which will improve their understanding and appreciation of their reading books. This will involve group discussions (including an initiative called Reciprocal Reading), practical activities, written activities coming from their reading, drama, art and ICT work. Parents can also help by ensuring that, as well as listening to their child read, they also make sure that there is time to talk about the book (the characters, setting, plot, the theme of the book, the language used). We will also continue with our second year of Accelerated Reader, with Mr Magee's Y5 class joining the programme for the first time. Last year we were able to raise the children's reading level attainment by, on average, **5 standardised points**. Well done everyone! Finally, we will arrange a reading workshop for the parents of children in P1 to give you an insight into how we teach reading in Mary Queen of Peace Primary School. Our literacy programme is led by our co-ordinator, Mrs McKeown, who will use the newsletter and website to keep you informed of developments in this curricular area.

CROSS-COMMUNITY TWINNING PROGRAMME

Y6 begin their cross-community Twinning Programme with Harryville PS. Through team games, with a focus on basketball, the pupils will explore mutual understanding.

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

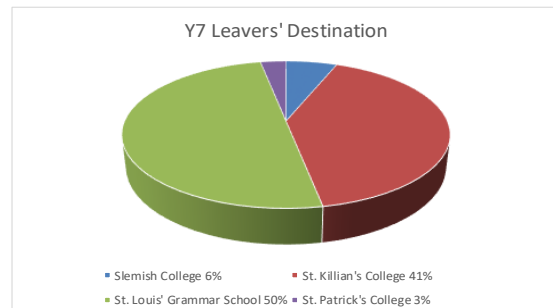
