SCHOOL BUILDING UPDATE

A communication statement on progress re the new school building project from CCMS and the Department of Education:

Work on the design/planning of the new school building which will be situated on land at Dunaghy Wood is progressing well. The Integrated Consultant Team (ICT), Hamilton Architects have completed RIBA Stage 1 (Royal Institute of British Architects-- Preparation & Brief) and this was submitted to the Department of Education (DE) for consideration and approval. DE have formally approved RIBA Stage 1 in a letter to the school trustee dated 18 September 2018. Hamilton Architects are now progressing the project to RIBA Stage 2 (Concept Design). It is anticipated that this stage will be completed and approved in the first quarter of 2019. When the plans are suitably developed past this stage a Planning Application will be submitted after prior consultation with the school authorities and the local community.

Further updates will be provided as the project progresses through the various design stages.

PARENTS' MEETINGS

Parent/Teacher meetings for Y2-7 classes will commence:

Week beginning Monday 22 October @ 2 p.m. each day.

School will close at 2 p.m. every day for all classes. Your child's teacher will inform you of the date and time of your appointment.

If you have more than one child at the school every effort will be made to arrange appointments on the same day.

PHOTOGRAPHER

The photographer will be in school on Tuesday 2 (Cargan site in morning), Wednesday 3 and Thursday 4 October.



Individual photographs will be taken for school records. Families who have requested a family group photo have been allocated a 10-minute slot and we would ask that you keep to this time. Family photographs will be taken on the Martinstown site, unless otherwise arranged. Please note Primary 7 class group photographs will be taken on Tuesday 2 October (afternoon) but their individual photo will be taken on Wednesday 3 October.

TRANSPORT

Significant improvements have been made to the school bus service this year. Our aim has been to get the children home earlier in the afternoon and to date we have achieved this. The Education Authority has now given us use of a bus for Mary Queen of Peace PS only; we therefore no longer have to share it with another school. Mrs Josie McIlhatton (Board of Governors) has been terrific in helping the school bring about this improvement, with the support of parents. This is an excellent example of the school working together with parents to improve the children's school experience. Thank-you for this.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

A number of school uniform orders were awaiting processing at the end of the summer. The school contacted the supplier, on behalf of parents, and they informed us that at busy times of the year (including August) it may take up to 21 days to process orders.

Last year we held a uniform evening on 9 May. In order to help parents with school uniform we will have a:

School Uniform Fitting Week from 13 – 17 May 2019.

Parents will be able to come to the school from 2 – 4.30 p.m. each day to try on samples of uniform with their children. This will allow plenty of time for the uniform to be ordered for the start of the new school.

CURRICULUM

Mary Queen of Peace PS has a 3-year School Development Plan (SDP) to manage its curricular, pastoral care, finance and accommodation priorities.

Personal Development & Mutual Understanding (PDMU) is an important part of the children's curriculum. The **School Council Elections** and the whole understanding of rights and responsibilities; democracy and the election process; and being actively listened to is part of our PDMU programme. The pupils' voice is very important in Mary Queen of Peace PS and this was recognised by the inspectors when they visited the school last year, when they noted that the children '*contribute meaningfully to decision making about matters which affect them.*' (ETI, BMIn April 2018).

School Council Elections will take place on **Friday 12 October**. We look forward to the campaigning!

Mutual Understanding is an important element of the PDMU curriculum and this year we will, once again, be involved in the Peace Players' initiative. Y6 will be *twinned* with Harryville PS (Ballymena). Through team games, with a focus on basketball, the pupils will explore mutual understanding.

The school has also formed a partnership with Camphill PS (Ballymena) and together we have successfully applied for a **Shared Education** grant. The Y4 teachers, from both schools, have been working on developing a programme which will improve the pupils' digital literacy skills, while the children learn to work and play together. The first ice-breaker for Y4 will be next month and it's a good one!
